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ARMED FORCES AND VETERAN PA SCHOLARSHIPS

AIR FORCE HEALTH PROFESSIONS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

ABOUT: Physician's Assistants are an in-demand and highly respected career within the Air Force. Active-duty Airmen can apply to the Physician Assistant Training program. The qualified individuals accepted into the program will receive the advanced training they need to provide expert medical care to military personnel and their families.

- Applicants must be U.S. citizens.
- Applicants must be physically qualified for commissioning as an Air Force officer.

Award Amount:

- Students receive full tuition and all required fees at the accredited U.S. medical school of their choice located within the continental U.S., Hawaii, Alaska, or Puerto Rico
- Books and most other educational fees are also covered under the HPSP scholarship
- An annual salary of \$34,000 which includes monthly stipend of \$2,728.00/month for 10 ½ months
- Second Lieutenant military and travel pay for the remaining 45 days, during their active-duty tour
- There is a \$20,000 signing bonus for students who receive a four (4) year AF HPSP scholarship, similar to the Army and Navy program. Likewise, three (3) year scholarship participants can receive the signing bonus if they agree to a four (4) year commitment.

ABOUT: SAPA is a civilian organization representing and supporting the US Army Physician Assistant, including Former, Active, Retired, Reserve, National Guard, Federally Employed and Civilian PAs. The Society's goals are to provide a forum for discussion, representation with the AAPA, and to provide high quality, low-cost CME to the Society's members and to the PA profession.

U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS HEALTH PROFESSION SCHOLARSHIP

ABOUT: The Health Professional Scholarship Program (HPSP) provides financial assistance to students receiving education or training in a direct or indirect health-care services discipline (Title 38 and Hybrid Title 38 occupations); and assists in providing an adequate supply of such personnel for the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). HPSP helps the Veterans' Health Administration (VHA) meet its need for qualified health care professionals for which recruitment or retention is difficult.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled or been accepted for full-time enrollment in an accredited PA program
- Applicants must have a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of at least 3.0 with 15 earned credit hours.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States. US Citizenship is defined as by birth or naturalization only. Those on Green Cards or Resident Alien status are not eligible for VA scholarship programs.
- Applicants must not be delinquent on payment of federal debt. This includes delinquent taxes, audit disallowances, guaranteed or direct student loans, Federal Housing Administration (FHA) or VA mortgages, and other miscellaneous administrative debts. Delinquent is defined as 31 days past due on a scheduled payment.

Award Amount:

- Tuition and Fees The HPSP award pays a participant's school tuition and approved fees through direct payment to the school. HPSP assistance includes topping off any existing grants and scholarship to ensure 100% of tuition and required/mandatory fees are paid.
- Stipend HPSP will pay a monthly stipend directly to the participants. The payment is made for each month a participant is enrolled in coursework, beginning with the first month of the school year. The current stipend amount is \$1200 per month.
- Book Stipend HPSP will pay an additional stipend to help cover books, paper, pens, pencils, computers, etc. This stipend is usually paid out annually during the July/August timeframe while under scholarship.

But she did not stop at her home state. Her efforts to bring diversity to the whole of the profession culminated in her leadership role as Secretary/Treasurer of the AAPA Minority Affairs Committee. Through the end of her professional days, she continued to work tirelessly to enhance recognition of the King/Drew Medical Center (now Martin Luther King, Jr., Outpatient Center) and the PA profession.

SCHOLARSHIP RESOURCES

There are **free** scholarship search platforms that connects students to thousands of possible scholarships, sweepstakes, grants, and internships available throughout the United States. Additionally, some platforms will automatically renew applicable scholarships and allow you to apply to multiple at the same time. Check out the list below (From *Forbes Advisor*)

Scholarships.com: divides scholarships by a variety of unique categories, including GPA, military affiliation, ethnicity, artistic ability, ACT or SAT score and residing state. When you select one of these categories, you'll likely see a large list of subcategories, where you can then view all eligible scholarships. This system helps students find niche awards with smaller applicant pools that they're more likely to win.

Fastweb.com: aggregates awards from both large and small directories. You have to make a profile to search for scholarships, which is similar to other sites. After the initial sign-up process, you can easily search for scholarships and filter your results based on several data points. Fastweb will also notify you when a new scholarship matching your description is posted and when you have upcoming deadlines.

CollegeBoard.org: You're probably familiar with the College Board if you've taken the SAT, AP tests or other college entry exams. The College Board can help you after you've been accepted into a school. After you create an account, you can filter awards by your interests, field of study, club affiliations or specific situations, like if your parents are divorced. College Board will also automatically match you with eligible scholarships based on the information in your profile. There is also an autofill function, which allows you to reuse information from other scholarship applications, saving you time and helping you apply for more awards.

GoingMerry.com: Applying to scholarships can feel repetitive; that's why Going Merry lets students type in information once and apply for multiple scholarships at the same time. If you're in a time crunch, look for awards on Going Merry before checking out the other major sites. The site also prides itself on including local awards, which are less competitive and may be easier to win than big national scholarships.

ScholarshipOwl.com: is a popular scholarship website that compiles awards and organizes them by amount, types of requirements, number of winners and length of time until the application is due. ScholarshipOwl will automatically resubmit your application to recurring scholarships that don't require anything beyond your basic information. This leaves you more time to focus on awards that require essays and recommendation letters.

Bold.org: While many scholarship sites are difficult to navigate, Bold.org has one of the cleanest interfaces. It's easy to search and find different scholarships you may be eligible for and you can filter by your education level, award category, award amount and deadline. You can even toggle on the "no-essay" button to find scholarships that don't require a written essay.

Appily.com: claims to be the biggest online scholarship database, so it could pay to check the site for possible leads. Like other sites, you have to create an account to see all the scholarships you might qualify for. Their filter system lets you sort awards by year in school, scholarship amount, gender, ethnicity and award deadline. You can also search for renewable scholarships, which offer college funding for multiple years.

MyScholly.com: When you fill out a profile on Scholly, their algorithm will comb through available scholarships and create a list of eligible awards. Each scholarship will have a Scholly score, which ranks how good of a fit it is for your background and experience. The higher the Scholly score, the stronger match you are with the scholarship's requirements.

CareerOneStop.org: The U.S. Department of Labor has its own scholarship website through the CareerOneStop portal. There are more than 8,000 scholarships listed, and you can filter awards by keyword or sort them by amount, deadline, residing

state and state where you'll be studying. There are scholarships available for students enrolled in a vocational school or working toward an associate's degree, as well as for undergraduate and graduate students.

General Board of Higher Education & Ministry: The GBHEM scholarship application opens in January of each year. You can only submit one application per year where it will be screened for all possible eligible programs. You may indicate on the first page of the scholarship application which of the programs you would most like to be considered for. Award amounts are given on the site and are a general estimate.
